Since the Paris Agreement on Climate Change in 2015, there's been a major shift in investment toward 'green finance'. This is likely to accelerate dramatically in the years ahead, for two reasons: COVID-19 and COP26.

Before COVID-19, the finance gap to stabilise climate change below 2° C was estimated at around \$7 trillion per year. COVID-19 recovery packages will influence even larger sums – with many governments prioritising a 'green recovery'.

In November 2021 the UK will host COP26, in partnership with Italy – the most important climate change meeting since Paris. Green finance is a major priority for climate negotiators.

Acting on climate change is moving from 'corporate social responsibility' to 'financial and strategic imperative'. In the decade ahead, every business model will need to be adjusted.

On 18 November 2020 the British Embassy in Ljubljana and the British-Slovenian Chamber of Commerce invite you to join leading UK and Slovenian green finance experts (see above) to discuss the important questions, including:

- Can green finance really affect future climate change?
- How can businesses and individuals access and use green finance, to be ready for the future?
